I wish could have gone to the University to see & hear you; but I could not--- I am very glad to hear of the birth of your son & of the good health of Mrs ---- Tell her I think she ought to come to the Mts: this summer on purpose to show him to me. I am sure that no one will take more interest in his future than I shall, or will be more glad to see his future than I shall, or will be more glad to see his father & mother.

I go next week with Mrs Lee to the Warm & Hot Springs - I think after seeing her comfortably located, I shall run over to the W. Sulphur with Mildred - leaving Agnes with her mother.
