

By the Governor of the Commonwealth
of Virginia, A Proclamation.

Whereas it is represented to the Executive
that the Court house of the County of
Rockbridge hath been destroyed by
fire, and that the Meeting house in
or near Lexington is deemed the
most proper place for holding Courts
for the said County until the Court
house shall be rebuilt: I have
therefore thought fit in pursuance of
an Act of the General Assembly, "reduc-
ing into one the several Acts concerning
the Adjournment and places of session
of certain Courts in certain cases," and
with the advice of the Council of State
to issue this Proclamation, directing
the Courts for the said County to be
held in the Meeting house aforesaid.

Given under my hand with
the Seal of the Commonwealth
annexed, at Richmond, this 16th
day of March 1802, and of the
year of the Commonwealth the
twenty sixth. J. M. Monroe
