NO DEVELOPMENT of the recent years, it seems to me, holds a finer promise of help for Washington and Lee than the class-agent plan for raising the alumni fund. The method is simple; the burden upon any single alumnus, we hope, is never heavy; the total results are of immense service to the University.

Beyond my power of expression is the sense of encouragement that stirred the campus last year when we learned that more than 1000 alumni, widely scattered in years, in professions, in residence, had contributed for the welfare of their Alma Mater. And here must be recorded our gratitude not only to these donors but also to the officials who gave generous and effective service as the class representatives.

If this plan is helpful in normal times, it is vastly more significant to us in such a period of emergency as we now have. The usual sources of revenue for the institution have been reduced, seriously reduced. At the same time, our efforts to provide special courses for our boys, and thus render maximum aid to our country, have cost money. It may be assumed that the expense of rendering this kind of extraordinary opportunity in connection with the National cause costs at least as much as an average department.

We shall be strengthened by the response that the sons of Washington and Lee may be able to offer to their school in the hour of acute need.

Report of the Fund Committee

OUR UNIVERSITY had its origins in a time of national stress. The devoted men who raised the first funds and those who contributed later to its endowment did so in the faith that Washington and Lee would live as a permanent institution. Its development and growth have surpassed their fondest expectations.

To Washington and Lee men of today, again in a time of great national stress, is given the opportunity to carry on their work. In times like the present it is well that we have things in which we can believe and depend upon to endure—things we are resolved shall never be lost to us or our children—the integrity of individuals and nations, the sanctity of our homes and institutions, freedom of worship, speech and thought. The history of Washington and Lee is the best guarantee that it will carry on with the task of instilling these principles into its students and continue to build men for democracy. Washington and Lee has emerged from every other national crisis, her values intact and unimpaired. We Alumni must stand behind her, now as in the past.

No student at Washington and Lee ever paid the full cost of his tuition. Many of us paid all that was charged on the bill, and many others were aided in part, but no one was asked to pay the full cost of instruction, of equipment, of maintenance, of depreciation, and of interest on the investment. Notwithstanding increases in the University endowment, the net income on this endowment has decreased alarmingly. The Alumni Fund has been and is essential in making both ends meet.

This is the tenth year of the Class Agent Plan and of the Alumni Fund, made up of annual contributions from loyal Washington and Lee men. Since its beginning in 1933, the Alumni Fund has grown in each succeeding year and the report submitted herewith for 1941 shows

that 1039 Washington and Lee men, or 13 per cent participated last year, contributing a total of \$8,438.90. While impressive, the fact remains that 87 per cent did not participate.

Your Committee, meeting in Lexington on February the 5th, carefully canvassed the needs and requirements of the University for the ensuing year, in the light of the present emergency. As Alumni know, the University itself defrays all alumni expenses and the gifts of Alumni are devoted to University purposes, approved and administered by the Alumni Fund Committee. For 1942 three outstanding needs have been listed. A card enclosed in each class letter gives you the opportunity of designating to which one of these needs your gift will be allocated:

COMPLETION OF INTRAMURAL FIELD:

The projected new program of physical education, designed for the war emergency, renders final completion of the field, already in use, absolutely essential.

EMERGENCY EQUIPMENT AND SPECIAL

COURES FUND: Primarily to aid in the purchase of special equipment needed for war courses, such as military fundamentals, meteorology, military photography, special maps and texts for courses in Naval history, Pacific and Latin American geography, rifle range equipment expense, and the like.

GENERAL UNRESTRICTED: Gifts so designated to be used for general purposes of University expense.

Our appeal is that you do your part by answering promptly your Class Agent's letter. Each and every contribution is vital, and it is vital that every Washington and Lee man make his contribution.
