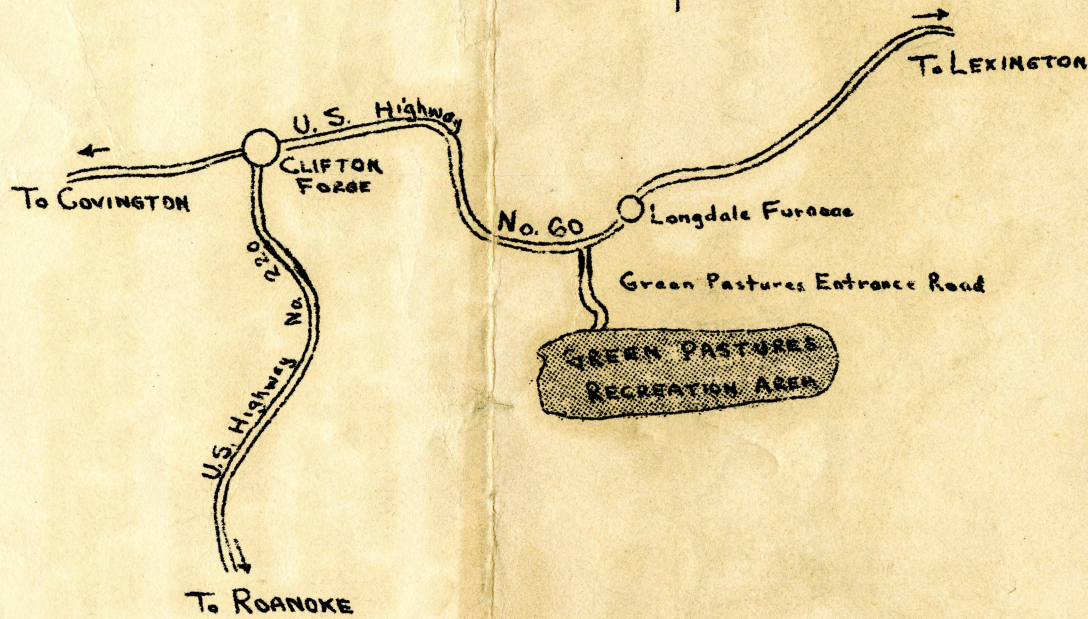


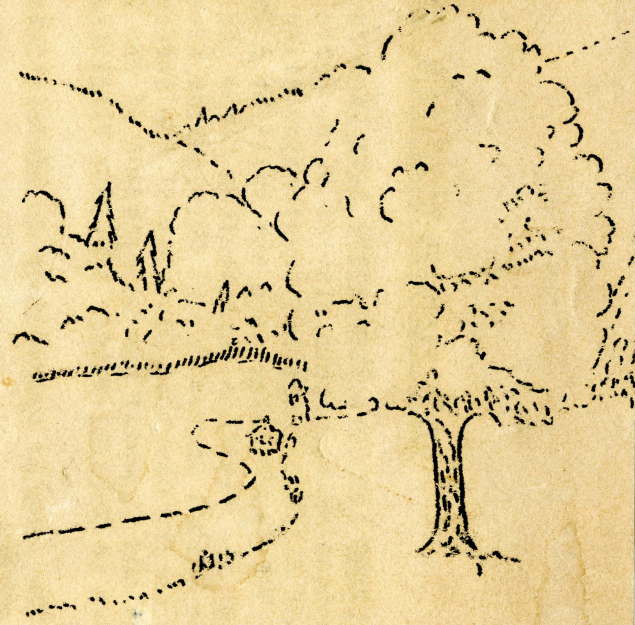

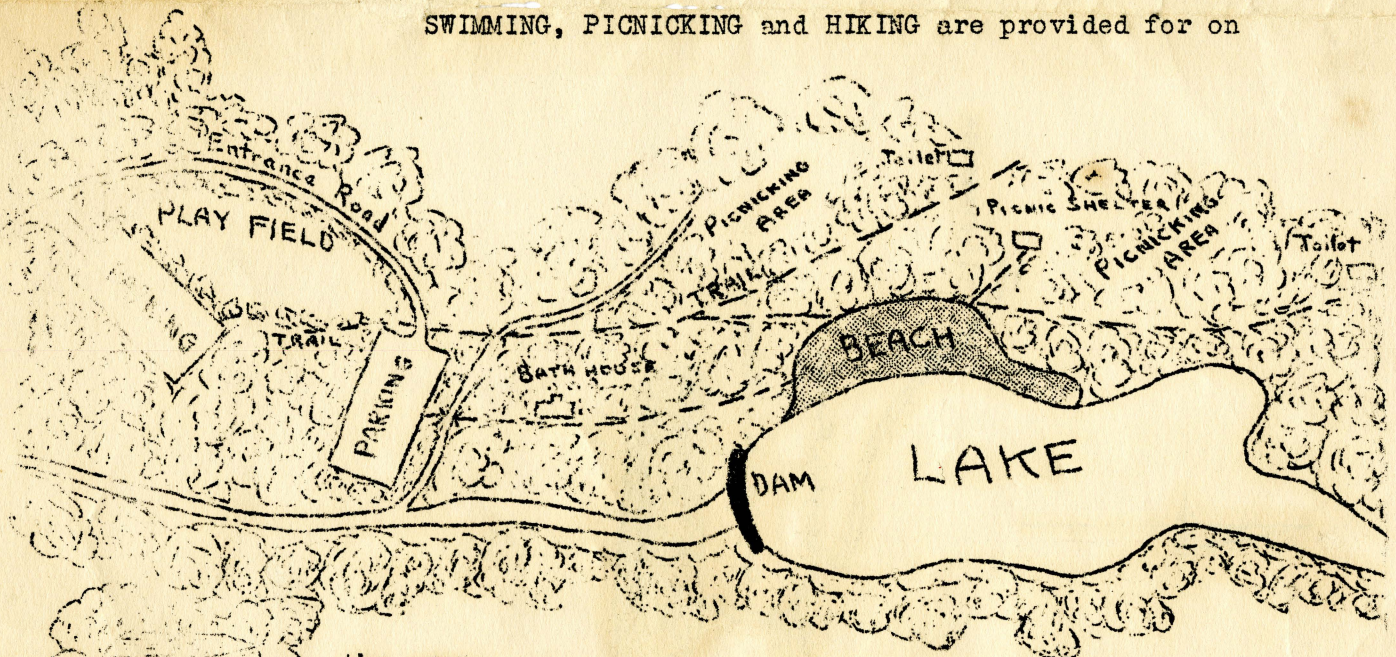

GREEN PASTURES RECREATION AREA

GREEN PASTURES RECREATION AREA (for the colored race) is located on the south side of U. S. Route 60, eight miles east of Clifton Forge and twenty-nine miles west of Lexington. This recreation area was built by a National Forest Camp of the Civilian Conservation Corps and is maintained by the United States Forest Service for free public use. It is on the Glenwood District of the Jefferson National Forest and is under the supervision of the District Ranger located at Natural Bridge Station, Virginia.

The area is operated by an Administrator assisted by life guards.

SWIMMING, PICNICKING and HIKING are provided for on



the area.

GREEN PASTURES LAKE and BEACH provide for the enjoyment of swimming from 11:00 A.M. until dark.

The BATHHOUSE, equipped with showers and sanitary facilities, is located so that clothing may be returned for safe-keeping to the cars on the parking area.

PICNIC SITES, with FIREPLACES and TABLES, and a convenient supply of PURE WATER are located a short distance from the parking areas.

WOOD for use in the fireplaces may be secured from the centrally located woodyard. Bring an axe for cutting it into fireplace lengths.
