She was a studious person who had the ability to converse about hapenings all over the world. The love she had for family was exemplified in her willingness to initiate and supervise her family's "Nature Club Outings" in Lexington. For many years, the family looked forward with anticipation to brainstorming with her in trying to make each outing better than the previous one and "Aunt Marie," as she was lovingly called by her nephews and nieces, was always in the middle of the happy times. We will miss her smile, her laughter, her love and enthusiasm and we thank God for the times we shared with Nannie Marie Wood Hayes.


