Such was the life of **Rosa Jeanette Scott Harris** whom God called to eternal rest on Wednesday, July 11, 2012. She was the seventh out of ten children born on November 3, 1945 to James and Lettie Scott.

Rosa was a 1964 graduate of A. G. Richardson High School. She worked at Louisa Manufacturing and Stone & Webster for a number of years.

In her early twenties she met and married James Berry Harris, Jr. from Waynesboro, VA. God blessed them with three children. She loved spending time laughing and cooking with her sisters. She was known for her delicious carrot cakes.

Rosa had a strong devotion to God and loved singing praises unto the Lord. In her early years, she attended and was baptized at Foster Creek Baptist Church in Louisa, VA. She sung on the choir and also in a gospel group called the Scott Sisters. Later she joined Galilee Baptist Church, Kents Store, VA and was an active member on the choir, as well as lead soloist with the Harris Singers, a gospel group formed with her husband. In 1986, Rosa and her family moved to Lexington, VA where her husband pastored First Baptist Church. In addition to being First Lady of the church, Rosa was one of the first females to be ordained as a Deacon. She also served as a Sunday school teacher, active in preparing and teaching annual vacation bible school, a faithful prayer warrior, and she even took her ministry door-to-door to tell others about Jesus. Her favorite songs were "To God be the Glory" and "My Soul is Anchored." Her favorite scripture was Psalm 23.

Rosa was predeceased by her loving husband Rev. James B. Harris, Jr. (March 1995); her parents, James Scott (April 1999) and Lettie Scott (September 2001); three sisters, Teresa Taylor (July 1978), Ann Jackson (May 1989), and Delaphine Grooms (September 1999); one sister-in-law, Shirley Scott (April 2010); and one niece, Wendy Taylor (February 1978).

Rosa leaves a legacy of courage, strength, and love to all that knew her. Survivors to cherish her memory are one son, Landon Harris and his wife Suzanne, Charlottesville, VA; two daughters, Letia Harris, Roanoke, VA and Antonette Jackson, New York, NY; four grandchildren, whom she adored, Dejuan, Phoenix, Zion and Abigayle; one sister, Linda Russell, Willingboro, NJ; five brothers, Oscar Scott, Roanoke, VA, James Scott, Williamstown, NJ, Gilbert, Alfonza and Millard Scott all of Louisa, VA; three sisters-in-law, Barbara and Susie Scott, Louisa, VA, and Isabel Scott, Singapore; two brothers-in-law, Robert Grooms, Louisa, VA and Larry Russell, Willingboro, NJ; two devoted friends, Irene Thompson and Kirby Phillips; and many other family members and friends that will miss Rosa.
