Reverend F. Todd Gray

Rev. Gray is a native of Chillicothe, Ohio, the son of Rev. Franklin E. Gray and Mrs. Cheryl A. Hitchens. He is a fourth generation preacher as his father is, and grandfather and greatgrandfather were ministers. He served in the U.S. Navy and entered the ministry shortly after his separation.



Rev. Gray is a graduate of Ohio University, and has Master's degrees from the School of Theology of Virginia Union University and Union Theological Seminary. He received an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from the Richmond Virginia Seminary. He teaches Church History and Theology at his alma mater, the Samuel Dewitt Proctor School of Theology of Virginia Union University.

Rev. Gray has received numerous honors and awards including selection as National Merit Scholar, the D.C. Rice Theological Scholarship, Union Theological Seminar Graduate Scholarship, the NAACP Community Leadership award, the SLC Leadership Award, as well as being honored with the key to the city and having the mayor proclaim "Rev. F. Todd Gray Day" in his honor on two separate occasions.

Rev. Gray has served in the ministries of the Zion Baptist Church of Chillicothe, Ohio and the First Baptist Church of South Richmond, Virginia. He has served pastorates at the New Hope Baptist Church in Ohio, the Mount Olive Baptist Church of Wicomico Church, Virginia, and the Fifth Street Baptist Church of Richmond, Virginia.

Rev. Gray has been the co-chairman of the City's Commission on African American Males, chairman of the City-wide Men's Revival, moderator of the Shiloh Association, chairman of Virginia Churches of the National Baptist Convention, a member of the Private Industry Council, the Richmond Renaissance Board, the United Way, the board of the Baptist General Convention and many other activities.

Rev. Gray has led the Fifth Street Baptist in our commitment to diversified ministry and community ministry leading such programs as community festivals, citizens' patrol groups, celebrated the first ever community baptism at Hotchkiss field, mentoring programs and other partnerships with local schools, establishment of the Northside District Community Development Corporation, leadership of the Highland Park Community Revival, development of a full service health clinic, erection of the multi-million dollar GRACE Center (God's Redemptive and Community Empowerment Center) and establishment of the Fifth Street Baptist Child Development Center, which educates almost 200 children each day.

He is married to the former Diane Harris and they have three children and two grandchildren.

Pastor Rahsaan Armand was born to Joseph and Rona Armand on May 26, 1975 in Chicago, II. He is a product of the Chicago Public School System. At the age of 16, Rahsaan gave his life to the Lord Jesus Christ. One year later, he trusted the Lord and accepted the call to preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ at the Monumental Baptist Church of Chicago under the leadership of Dr. Christopher A. Hill, Jr.

Pastor Rahsaan Armand obtained his BA from Northwestern University, Evanston, IL in Journalism and Religion. He continued his education and received the M.Div. and D. Min from the Trinity International University, Deerfield, IL.

Dr. Armand has authored two publications and has written extensively about Church growth and administration. He has lectured and taught in the National Baptist Convention, USA, INC. He has facilitated youth conferences and preached in several churches around the USA.

Since March 2007, Pastor Armand has been the Senior Pastor of the Mount Zion Missionary Baptist Church of Clarksburg, West Virginia. He is the representative of the faith community that provides ministry and insight to the members of the Clarksburg City Council which has improved race relations in the city.

In May 2013, Pastor Rahsaan Armand married the love of his life, the former Ms. Anita Johnson of West Virginia. They together have three beautiful daughters.

Church History

In the 1800's a number of African Americans worshipped in the three of the Lexington, Virginia white churches: Manley Memorial Baptist Church, the Grace Episcopal Church (formerly Robert E. Lee Church), and the Lexington Presbyterian Church. On Sunday, September 22, 1867, these African-American members, many who were former slaves, were permitted to withdraw from their churches and organize the Lexington

African Baptist Church of Lexington, VA. Meetings were held in various locations, led by the Reverend. Milton Smith, who was reared in the community and baptized in the Manley Memorial Baptist Church in 1841 served as the first pastor, the Lexington African Baptist Church.

More than 25 years later, the Lexington African Baptist Church purchased a lot next to their existing church with the intention of erecting a new building. Almost 30 years from the date of organization, the First Baptist Church of Lexington, VA's edifice was completed, and the corner-

stone was laid on Wednesday, July 4, 1894. Friends and laborers gathered after working all day to dig the foundation. The women held lanterns to provide light as there was no electricity in Lexington, VA. Masons from Amherst, Virginia came to help build the church. Local residents helped with the carpentry. Thousands of people gathered to attend the Opening Day Worship Service at the First Baptist Church of Lexington, VA. Eleven years later, September 1905 the record states that 1400 persons attended the Mortgage Burning Services.

The Sanctuary is fully utilized today as the Worship site for the First Baptist Church of Lexington, VA. More than 30 pastors and several Interim Pastors have served this congregation. On Sunday, July 30, 2017, the congregation called the Pastor McKinley A. Williams of Detroit, MI to be the Pastor of the First Baptist Church of Lexington, VA. Pastor Williams accepted the call and started his pastoral ministry in First Baptist Church on Sunday, November 5, 2017. The First Baptist Church has been serving the city of Lexington for more than 150 years.
