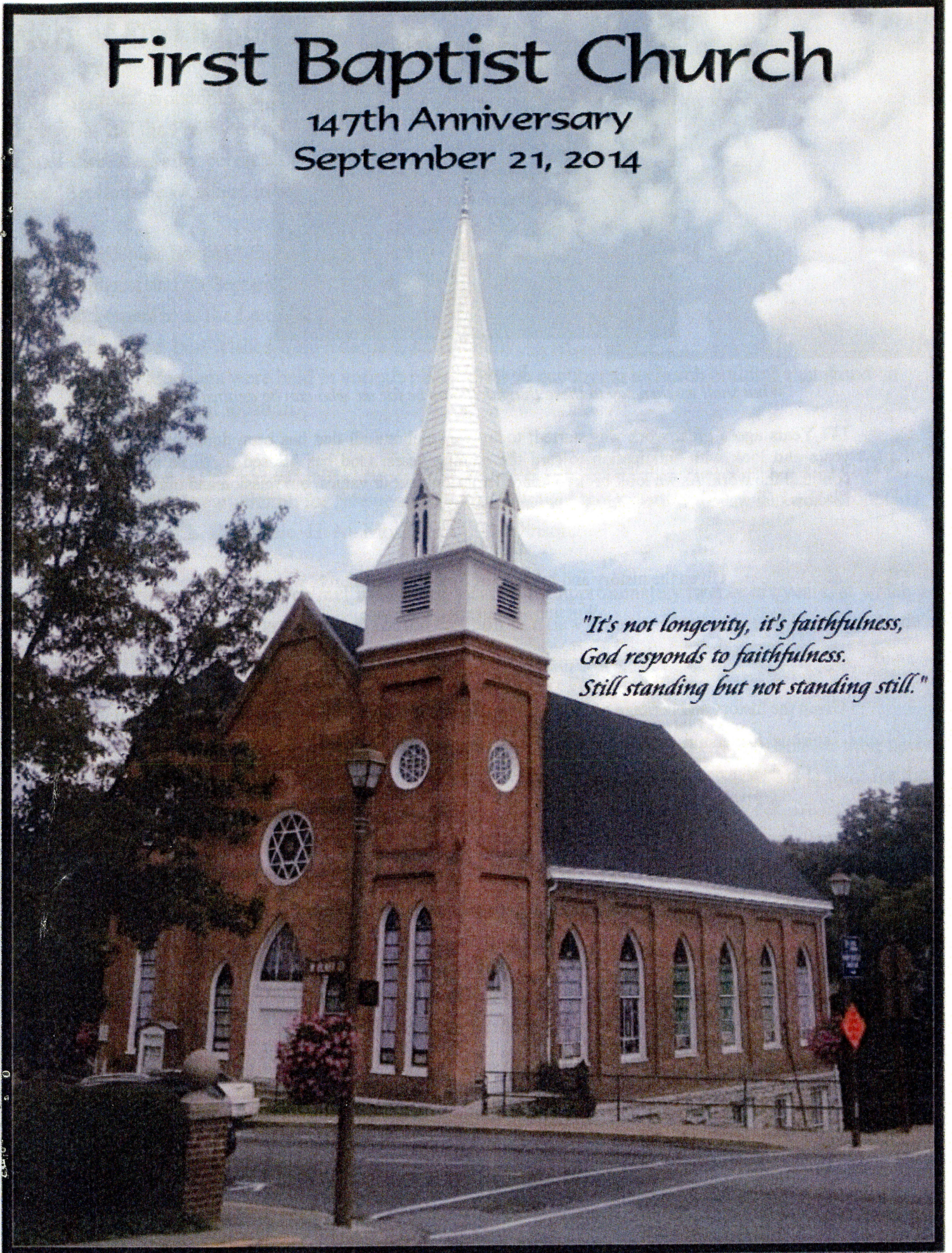

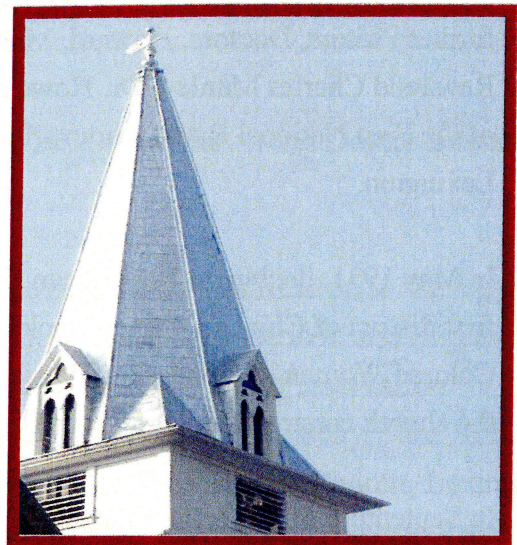

## History of First Baptist Church

In 1867 "Negroes" worshipping at Manley Memorial Baptist Church, the Episcopal and the Presbyterian Churches, felt the need for a church of their own, after constantly hearing sermons preached from the text, "Servants be Obedient to Your Masters."

Known as the "Black Baptist," this body of worshipers requested letters of dismissal and on September 22, 1867 were permitted to withdraw and organize as the Lexington African Baptist Church. They were counseled, best wishes were extended, and friendly feelings prevailed. Meetings were held in various places prior to occupying a church building that stood on the north side of the present location.



Pastor Milton Smith, a product of the community, baptized at the Manley Memorial Baptist Church in 1841, served as leader of this "new" church for five years. He was followed by Pastors G. Elliot, T. L. Jackson, G.B. Howard, W. M. Troy, J.L. Barksdale, H. M. Moss and G. T. Johnson.

The Lexington African Baptist Church met in this first location for approximately twenty-six years, at which time the lot next to the church was purchased for the erection of a new church. Brother David Humbles made the first contribution of \$25.00 to this new structure and he was joined by Brothers Lylburn Downing, Joe Thomson, Harvey Harper, Hugh Harvey, Richard Osborne, Robert Price and Phillip Pryor.

After concluding their day's work, members would gather at the church site to dig the foundation for their new building. As there was no electricity in Lexington at that time, the women held lanterns to provide light for the workers. The Moore's from Amherst, Virginia were the masons and they were assisted by Mr. Ira Poindexter, Lexington resident. Mr. Richard Jones and other helpers were the carpenters. The combined efforts of these persons and others caused the edifice in which we now worship to become a reality. Under the leadership of Reverend W. T. Johnson, the cornerstone was laid on July 4, 1894.

The church membership joined the Baptist General Association (now known as the Baptist Allied Bodies), established in 1898. Virginia Union University was then and continues to be the religious training site for young men and women in the ministry. The church membership supported the ideas of the Baptist General Association until 1955.

Monday, September 29, 1905, was an exciting night, at what by then had become First Baptist Church. Over 400 persons joined Pastor P. S. Lewis and the congregation to observe the mortgage being paid off and the signing of the bonds by Mrs. Sadie Lewis. Returning for the occasion and giving remarks were

former Pastors, Doctors, Howard, Moss and Johnson. They were joined in addressing the gathering by Reverend Charles Manley, Dr. Howe of Washington and Lee University and Mr. B. E. Vaughn, President of the First National Bank, whom all emphasized the pleasant relations existing between the races in Lexington.

In May 1931, the Negro Republican Congressman, the Honorable Oscar DePriest, who represented the first district of Chicago, Illinois spoke at the church. Congressman DePriest was hosted by the Walker Colored Women's Foundation (this is no longer in existence). The Reverend John Goodgame was pastor of the church congregation at that time.

In September of 1937, the Masonic Lodge of Virginia met at the First Baptist Church for three days. The Reverend Corey Mitchell was the pastor of the church on that occasion.

July 1952, The Baptist General Sunday School Convention convened at the church. Reverend Peter Crawford had just been called to serve as pastor of the church on this occasion.

The first church Homecoming celebration was held at First Baptist Church on the second Sunday in August in 1965 under the leadership of Reverend Curtis Cofield.

In June 4, 1987, Pastor James B. Harris was formally installed as pastor and the church membership grew as new members joined the church by baptism, Christian experience, and by letter. A second choir was organized and a Board of Christian Education was organized in 1990. The Budget and Finance Committee was rejuvenated, the church restrooms were remodeled, and new doors were added to the outside entrances to the church. The Word of God was preached each Sunday morning and prayer meeting and Bible study were held at the church on Wednesday evenings led by Pastor Harris. It can be said that Pastor Harris was a diligent worker who worked hard to improve the spiritual aspects of the church and served the community well while serving on boards, commissions and Lexington City Council. Pastor Harris remained with the church congregation until his death in 1995.

The First Baptist Church congregation called Reverend LaVert H. Taylor in 1996 to serve as the 29th pastor. During his first year as pastor 66 individuals became members of First Baptist Church. Pastor Taylor formed the Joint Board which consisted of all church leaders, rejuvenated the Board of Christian Education, a new gospel choir was formed under the director of Mrs. Ethel Bouthal from Washington D.C. and in 2002, two female deacons were ordained to serve the church. They were Deacon Irene Thompson and Deacon Rosa Harris (former First Lady of the church and wife of the late Pastor James B. Harris). Pastor Taylor held a dynamic Bible Study and prayer service each Wednesday with a minimum of fifteen First Baptist members as well as members from other churches and he preached numerous revivals, homecomings and anniversaries throughout the state each year. He served the community well while serving on boards, commissions and Lexington City Council as well as Chaplain for Lexington/Rockbridge

rea Hospice. Pastor Taylor resigned as the spiritual and temporal leader of the church congregation in 2004 to relocate to the Nevada area.

The First Baptist Church family continued without a pastor until February 2006 when Reverend Doctor Edward R. Hambry was called as pastor.

In July of 2005, at a scheduled church meeting, the church family agreed to support the nomination to the Virginia Department of Historic Resources. Trustee Rosalya Wiggins, assisted by Deacon Edlow Morrison and Sisters Sylvia Brooks and Mabel Poindexter, and contributed information to Dan Pezzoni, Landmark Preservation Society, for his work on the nomination to the Virginia Landmark. At a meeting held on Thursday, June 8, 2006, the State Review Board and the Virginia Historic Resources Board considered the First Baptist Church, Lexington, for inclusion in the Virginia Landmark Registry. A recommendation to the National Registry of Historic Places was also made at that time.

In the 147 year history of First Baptist Church, the congregation has been led by other educated, dynamic and committed pastors. Some of the other leaders were: Pastors W. R. Lucas, J. Carruthers, J. W. Tynes, J. A. Hinkley, S. A. Thurston, N.J. Gonslaves, P.W. Cook, J.W. Goodgame, Corey Mitchell, Everett Green, Peter Crawford, J. Cooper, V. Sims, Curtis Cofield, John Trotman, Lutrell Rainey, Theodore Anthony, and James Scott. While being without a pastor from 2009 -2011 the church was blessed with two excellent interim pastors, Rev. James L. Harris, Pastor of First Baptist Church of Ordinary, VA and Dr. Earl L. Pendleton, Assistant Pastor of Mt. Zion First African Baptist Church in Charlottesville, VA.

The church is presently under the pastorate of Dr. Louis F. Grandberry from Ohio.

Other church leaders are Deacon Edlow Morrison, Chairperson Fellowship of Deacons, Irene Thompson, Deacon, Robert Fields, Deacon; Mr. Preston Evans, Chairperson Trustee Ministry; Cabot Miller, Trustee, Rosalya Wiggins, Trustee, Barbara Wright, Trustee, Mr. Edwin Walker, Co-Chairperson Finance Ministry, Priscilla Baker, Co-chairperson, Finance Ministry; Mrs. Marilyn Alexander, Treasurer; Mrs. Mabel Poindexter, Financial Secretary, and Mrs. Montrose Grandberry, Church Clerk.

There are many other recent events within the history of First Baptist Church, Lexington, such as a new roof in 2010, painting of the lower sanctuary in 2011, bridge added to the back property for individuals needed handicap access to the church, repairs to half of the ceiling area in 2013, funding from the Ushers to repair the other half of the ceiling in 2014 and the recent painting and repairing of the church steeple including new Plexiglas for the steeple windows and painting several windows surrounding steeple.

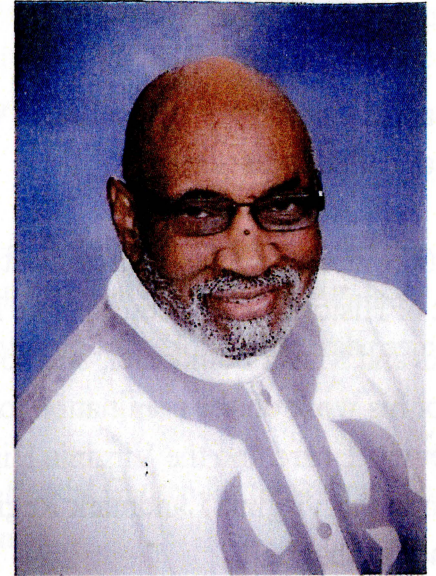

**Rev. LaVert H. Taylor,**

of Norfolk, VA, and our former pastor, will be the speaker for the morning service. He has pastored churches in Chapel Hill, North Carolina; Norfolk, Charlottesville, and the First Baptist Church in Lexington, Virginia. He is currently Pastor Emeritus, First Baptist Church, Norfolk, VA.



He is a native of Shreveport, Louisiana, and attended Grambling College but at the start of the Civil Rights Movement he organized the Shreveport chapter of the Congress of Racial Equality and later served for six years as a Field Representative for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, under the leadership of the late Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.

He received his B. S. Degree in Public Administration from Shaw University in Raleigh, North Carolina and his Master of Divinity Degree from Virginia Union University in Richmond, Virginia. He has also done doctoral studies in Adult Education at George Mason University in Fairfax, Virginia.

His work history includes the U. S. Office of Economic Opportunity, the U. S. Commission on Civil Rights, and the U. S. Department of Commerce. In March of 2004 he became a Case Manager for the Center for Academic Enrichment and Outreach at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas and later accepted a position, providing spiritual guidance and organization to 1,500 inmates and 600 staff members at the Southern Desert Correctional Center in Indian Springs, Nevada where he retired and relocated to the Norfolk area.

He has served as an Independent Training Contractor for the Central Intelligence Agency, the U. S. Department of Agriculture, and the District of Columbia Superior Courts. He also conducts training for church leaders, including Deacons, Trustees, Ushers, and other organizational leaders.

During his seven years in Lexington, Virginia he served as a Member of the Virginia State Board of Medicine, the U. S. Attorney's Task Force on Hate Crimes, the Ethics Committee of the Virginia State Bar Association, Chaplin for Rockbridge Area Hospice, Chaplain for the Lexington Police Department, Member of the Lexington City Council, President of Rockbridge County NAACP, President of the Lexington Area Ministerial Alliance, Moderator of the Natural Bridge Baptist Association, Director of Christian Education for the Berean Valley Baptist Association, Board Member of the Rockbridge Area Community Services Board, and a Member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity.

Rev. Taylor is the father of one daughter, three sons, and grandfather of ten.

## **Rev. Anthony Perry,**

speaker for the evening service is a native of Waynesboro, VA and graduate from Waynesboro H.S.; entered Washington and Lee University the fall of 1973. While attending W&L, Pastor Perry was a Dean's List Student who also excelled in Athletics, while attending the NCAA Track and Field Championships and receiving First Team All-American honors in Football. After graduation and a tryout with the New England Patriots, he entered U.S. Army, as a 2nd Lieutenant in the Finance Corps.



As with most military officers, he had both stateside and overseas assignments. During Desert Storm, he was the mobilization and training director for 25 Reserve and National Guard logistics units, in which he received numerous awards, the key to the City of Indianapolis, and an open invitation to the Indy 500 race. Besides being a Battalion Commander in Europe, the Army also sent him fully funded to receive a graduate degree at Virginia Tech, in Blacksburg, Va. While at Virginia Tech, he was selected by the faculty as the captain of the graduate school's first three member business school case competition team, which came in second among 11 major universities, including Universities of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, and Mississippi to name a few. He retired from the Army in 1994, from the United States Special Operation Command at MacDill Air Base, in Florida, where he was responsible for a \$600 million budget as the Deputy Comptroller for Research Development and Acquisition. He was also the first US Army Finance Officer to be assigned to the General Staff of Special Operations.

It was in the military, that Pastor received his call into the ministry. In Germany, he led a small group that founded Rhenberg Bible Baptist Church. During graduate school, 1986, he was licensed to preach at Gateway Baptist Church, in Blacksburg. In 1995, he was ordained to preach at Providence Baptist Church, in Riverview Florida and became the associate pastor at Temple Heights Baptist Church, in Tampa, FL. In 1999, he founded Emmanuel Baptist Church, in Thonotosassa, FL. The ministry has also sent him to both stateside and overseas. He has spoken for conferences and crusades around the world, including Israel, Thailand, India, Burma, England, Suriname, Guyana, Mexico, Costa Rico, as well as in many cities throughout America. He works full-time while he continues to lead the church.

Rev. Perry has been married to Deborah Baker, daughter of Marie and the late Wendell Baker, Sr of Lexington, for 36 years and they have six children and two grandchildren. Alana is owner of an Assisted Living Facility, in Ruskin, FL; Kelly is working for the county and has an eight year old son, Anthony and living in Tampa; David, a Deputy Sheriff, and his wife Katie, an accountant, live in Roanoke with their two year old son Joshua; Daniel lives in Orlando, FL and he is a Forensic Analyst with Florida Department of Law Enforcement; and Esther and Priscilla both attend Pensacola Christian College, Pensacola, FL.
