**COURSE OF STUDY.****PREPARATORY.**

The requisites for admission to the *regular College course*, are a competent knowledge of the English Grammar, Geography and Arithmetic—especially Vulgar and Decimal Fractions and Proportion—thorough acquaintance with Latin and Greek Declensions and Syntax, (the Grammars of Bullions are used,) and the reading of the following books, or their equivalents: Bullions' Latin Reader, Cæsar, Virgil, Cicero's Orations and Ovid; Bullions' Greek Reader throughout, and John's Gospel. It will be in vain for young men to apply for admission to the regular classes of College, unless they are well drilled in the principles of Latin and Greek Grammar.

**COLLEGE CURRICULUM.****FRESHMAN CLASS.****LATIN.**

Livy (Lincoln's); Cicero de Senectute and de Amicitia; Arnold's First and Second Latin Books; Ancient Geography, (Mitchell's) and Roman Antiquities. Anthon's editions will not be tolerated in any of the classes.

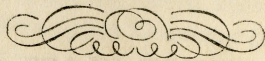

**SCIENTIFIC DEPARTMENT.**

Students who do not wish to take the full College course are allowed to recite with the regular classes on any of the above studies, for which the Faculty shall judge them competent; it being required that each student shall have at least three daily recitations, and attend to the regular exercises in Composition and Declamation.



## MILITARY INSTRUCTION.

In addition to Fortification and Gunnery, instruction and exercises in military tactics will be given by the Cincinnati Professor, whenever a class of sufficient size can be formed.

## APPARATUS, LIBRARIES AND CABINET.

The College has an excellent Chemical and Philosophical Apparatus, which cost about five thousand dollars, and is kept in good order.

The Library contains about two thousand five hundred volumes; those of the two literary societies, three thousand five hundred in the aggregate. Provision is made for the gradual increase of the College Library, and the Societies display a highly commendable zeal in this cause.

The Cabinet of Natural History consists chiefly of minerals, of which there are about three thousand specimens, well adapted, by variety and arrangement, for illustrating that important branch of natural science. *Additional specimens are solicited.*

## RELIGIOUS AND MORAL CULTURE.

This is accounted of primary importance; as the increase of intellectual power is not a benefit or a blessing, unless placed under the controlling influence of right moral feeling. Our means of securing this all-important end, are, the regular morning and evening worship of the College assembled as a family; this consists of reading a portion of sacred Scripture, singing and prayer; Bible recitation on Sabbath; and the public lecture in the chapel. Students are also required to attend one other public exercise on Sabbath, in such place as their parents or guardians may direct. There is access, regularly, to service in the Presbyterian, Baptist, Methodist and Episcopal churches: and of course we exercise no constraint as to which they shall at-



tend, unless specially requested by parents. With these are combined the parental vigilance of the members of the Faculty, who have rooms in the College, and spend a large portion of their time in them. If these appliances, together with frequent, private, kindly conference with the students, fail of securing upright moral deportment and application to study, then, with conscientious severity, we carry out our law, Chap. I. 12. "The Faculty shall require of all students, a strict obedience to the College Laws and regulations; and they shall, in no case suffer a disorderly, immoral or negligent student, to continue in the College, unless he soon amend his conduct after being duly admonished." Parents may rely upon us, that we will not allow any youth to remain here, if we have reason to believe him endangering his moral welfare by the formation of bad habits. We are happy to be able to say, that more than one-fourth of our students, at present, are consistent professors of religion; and it is our constant prayer, and shall be our unceasing endeavour, that He, whose is the residue of the Spirit, may descend as the rain and distil as the dew, until the proportion be greatly increased.

### LOCATION AND TRAVELING FACILITIES.

The geographical position of this College commends it to a very wide range of country. The whole of Virginia, west of the Blue Ridge, except the northwestern corner of the State and a considerable portion that skirts its southeastern base, will find access to it easier than to any other College. Students from Eastern Virginia can reach Lexington from Richmond or Alexandria in 16 hours.

The unrivalled beauty of its mountain scenery, contributes not a little to its advantage, in the view of all persons who duly appreciate the power which the sublime scenes of nature operate upon the mind, and especially upon the youthful mind. It



is not possible, that the eye of youth, under a course of intellectual training, should continually rest upon our undulating hills and rise to the summit of our majestic mountains, without lifting the spirit to something of their own sublimity.

---

### EXPENSES.

The Treasurer's bill, per annum, is—Tuition, \$40; Room rent, \$4; Deposit, for incidental expenses, \$8; Matriculation fee, \$2. Total, \$54; always payable in advance. Extra tuition—for instruction in one Modern Language, \$5; in two or more, \$8.

Boarding can be had in private families, for from \$9 50 to \$10 per month, payable in advance—making \$95 or \$100 per annum; washing, \$1 per month; fuel and light about \$12; bed [if rented] about \$7. Thus the highest necessary cost is \$183. Boarding, washing, fuel, and lights, can be had a short distance from town for \$9 per month, making the lowest total expense \$147. To Students entering after the 1st of February, the Treasurer's bill is only \$33.

A drawback of deposit money is made at the end of the session, which varies according to incidental expenses and damages.

All parents or guardians who give money to their sons or wards, to pay any portion of their board in advance, as is usually done, are advised to require the immediate transmission of a receipt for the amount, as young men are often tempted by the possession of money, to waste it in extravagance or vice. And if parents or guardians desire that their sons or wards should make bills with the merchants in Lexington, they are requested to inform the Faculty of that desire; and in case bills are made contrary to law, they are especially requested not to pay them, but to forward them to the Faculty.



Since 1854, the Faculty have been required by an order of the Board, to admit to all the privileges of the College, *tuition free*, all *indigent young men*, of good character and talents, who may apply for such privileges.

Let all parents and guardians bear in mind the corrupting influence of pocket money. A pocket full of money and a head full of sense are rarely, if ever, found together in Colleges.

### SOCIETIES.

The Graham Philanthropic Society was founded in A. D. 1809. It has two thousand volumes in its library.

The Washington Literary Society was founded in A. D. 1812, and has one thousand five hundred volumes.

The halls of both are tastefully fitted up, and though, not by any means as capacious as is desirable—indeed, *necessary* for pleasant and profitable public speaking, yet are made the theatres of much exciting, emulous discussion, essays and criticisms, greatly conducive to the welfare of the College and to the students' preparation for public employments.

### THE SESSION—COMMENCEMENT.

The Session opens on the Second Thursday (13th) of September. Punctuality in attendance at the opening of the Session is of the utmost importance. Deficiencies are mainly due to missing or neglecting the first lessons.

*The Commencement Exercises* will take place on the 3d July.

There will be no recess during the Session, except Christmas day.



**REPORT OF THE EXAMINING COMMITTEE.**

FEB. 12th, 1855.

*To the Board of Trustees.*

It has been our privilege to attend the intermediate examinations in Washington College, which close this evening, and it gives us great pleasure to testify to the thoroughness with which they have been conducted. The test to which the students have been brought, is a severe one. They have been examined on *all* the studies of the past five months, the particular topic, or passage to be read, being in all cases assigned by some other than the Professor—at random, and from any and every part of the studies gone over during the term. The examinations have been partly oral, partly exercises on the blackboard, and partly written. In the Senior class on Mathematics, written answers and demonstrations were required of questions written on the blackboard, to be completed in the examination room, of course, without assistance from any source. An idea of the extent of these examinations and their searching nature may be formed from the fact that they have continued through six days—occupying from 9 o'clock A. M. until 10 o'clock P. M., with brief intervals for meals—about ten hours on an average each day. Such examinations are no mere form; and from the closest scrutiny—made during an attendance nearly all the time every day by one at least of us—we are sure that it is an utter impossibility for any but one who has brains and uses them diligently, to pass such an ordeal with any honor. The only thing we have seriously regretted in these examinations, is that so few of those who are interested in the subject of education attend them. Is this right?

### Triennial Register of the Alumni.

The following is an attempt, and we regret to say only a partially successful attempt, at a complete list of our Alumni. This part of the early history of our Alma Mater is involved in considerable obscurity. The high-minded and noble hearted men, who did what may be truly called the pains-taking and the self-denying part of the labour upon her early foundation, appear to have been little aware of the magnitude of their own work. Their hands were alternately occupied with the workman's tool, and the slaughter-weapon. And, when the savage Indian was repelled on the West, and the no less savage Briton and Hessian on the East, they had to contend with the pinchings of poverty; partly resulting from the exhaustions of the war and the derangement of the currency; but more from its demoralizing and paralyzing influence, which for some time pervaded the community and produced a dead insensibility to the importance of moral, intellectual and religious training. Attention being thus diverted toward procuring the means of life, these patrons of learning gave little of their anxiety to the enrolment and recording of names, and even to the formal conferring of degrees. Prior to 1805, no matriculation book seems to have been kept—no rolls or register. And yet, doubtless, some of the brightest names in our country's history, obtained here, before that, the mental and moral drilling which made them the glory of the age. The Alumni Association twelve years ago, made an effort to remedy this defect, and adopted as the principle of their enrolment the rule of putting down all students who could be ascertained to have obtained the chief part of their education here—say two full years of study. The result of this attempt we have been kindly favoured with, by our late venerable President, and now present it, with such additions as we have been able to make, on safe grounds. Sure we are, it is very defective, we however hope it may form the basis, upon which the Alumni Association may, by additions and corrections, in a few years, complete the list of honoured names, and perpetuate, with freshness of recollection, so interesting a portion of the history of Washington College.

The Association earnestly solicit information that may enable them to correct the following list, for a future edition: either in regard to additional names, titles, location or occupation: or for the removal of names which may be improperly inserted. We wish the record to speak true history.

## VIRGINIA CINCINNATI SOCIETY.

The Association of the Cincinnati Society of Virginia was organized by the surviving Officers of the Revolution, soon after the close of the war. The objects of the society were:—1. To perpetuate the bond of union which had kept them so firmly bound together during their long struggle for Independence; and 2. To raise by individual contributions a common fund, for the relief of such widows and orphans as had been left by any of their comrades, or might be left by themselves, in circumstances requiring pecuniary aid.

After some years, it was thought expedient to dissolve the association. It was then found, that after providing for all remaining widows and orphans, there would be a large residuary fund still on hand. This fund they resolved, in imitation of their illustrious Commander-in-Chief, to add to the endowment of Washington College, under certain specified conditions. The college having accepted and fulfilled these conditions, is now in full possession of this donation, amounting at present to about \$23,000.

As a token of obligation to the Society of Cincinnati for their liberality, the College requires of the best scholar in every class of graduates, an oration in honor of the Society. This is always a part of the annual commencement exercises.

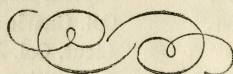

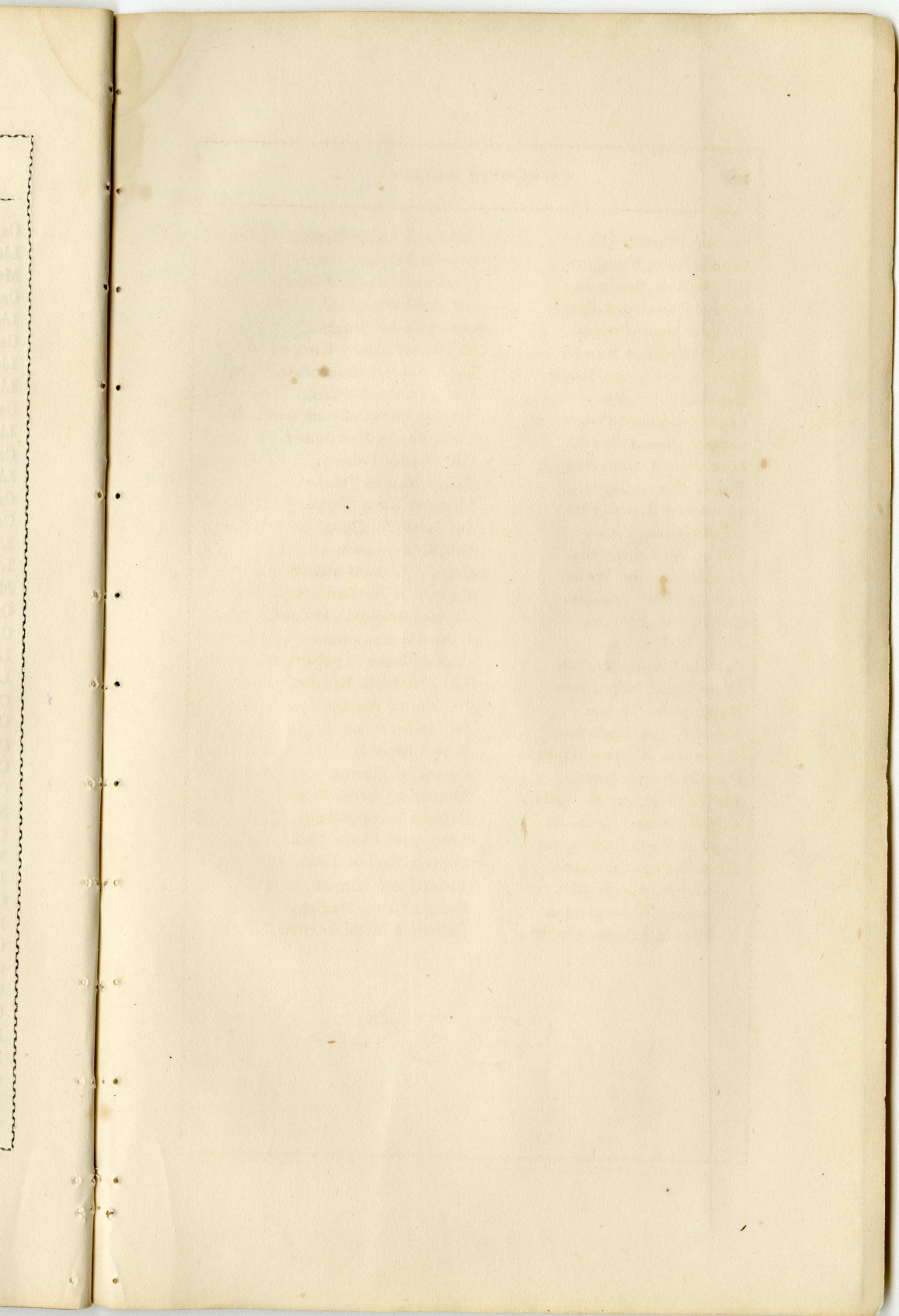

SUPPLEMENT TO THE CATALOGUE  
OF  
WASHINGTON COLLEGE.

The Students of this institution are graded in all the departments of study by a system of marking, as follows: The value of every recitation is expressed by a number referring to 100 as the maximum. The average of all the marks thus given to a student in any class, determines his standing in that class. Delinquencies of all kinds (not meriting higher penalty) are also expressed in numbers, (demerit marks,) varying upward as high as 12, according to the nature of the offence. The *sum* of all the demerit marks subtracted from 100 determines the student's standing in conduct. A combination of the average of the marks attained in all the departments of *study*, with the *conduct* mark, gives the *general grade* of the student as compared with others in the same class.

In the following tables, the column of numbers on the *left* gives the *general grade* in conduct and scholarship combined. The columns marked "Mathematics," "Latin," "Greek," &c., denote the grades attained in these several branches of study.

In the column marked "Conduct," the numbers are to be referred to 100 as the maximum, which denotes entire exemption from demerit.
