As I have not re-

orted for duty yet & have nothing to do to-day I will employ my time writing home

I got to Sturton Friday morning about 4 in the morning, staid all day then started about 4 in the evening with fifteen passengers for Mount Jackson, where we got on the cars & went to Strasburg, from there we went to Winchester in a buck wagon 16 passengers on, I had to stand up for about a mile, was wet to the skin when I got there, dried myself by the fire & started to the Camp, where I found all the boys well & dirty. I got mine jin in time, for the company was paid off for two months, about an hour after I got there so I am sick & can have my pepper bottle filled with rye, the boys are very much pleased at the contents of my box, especially the turkey which we fixed off for

dinner & left many bones, the pepper ~~was~~ boy & I don't want you to forget
also was very acceptable & from the way that boy acted. The view is on
They are using it, & think my flask will soon be ready to fill up with
medicinal whiskey. Our mess was mine was the first that came to camp
fortunate as we got another boy the same another came soon after I got there,
day for Harry should which John brought

down. It is as cold as charity & doing that comfort without fail as
in a big city, snow on all the hills around Bay says it is not at all comfortable
here and looks like it would come to do without it. Every thing is dry
down here soon, we are prepared for here (except the ground) as I have
it rough, all the tents have fire places now. I will write again
in time & one as warm as a worm, when - soon

I just went into them & was standing
around shooting around & stuck my leg
into the fire place & burnt my pants all
to pieces, the boys thought I ought to be
