Camp Stonewall  
Aug 3<sup>rd</sup>/63  
Dear Sister

I have just received your letter of the 22<sup>nd</sup> July, the first mail we have had for some time.

We are now in Camp near Orange Ct, arrived here Saturday Evening, yesterday heard a sermon from Rev Mr. McLean of Monroe who is for the present acting Chaplain for our Regt, a very good sermon but rather too much on the Methodist order, in the Evening attended a meeting of the Christian Association, which (meetings) are very pleasant & instructive. I believe I gave you an account of our mode of conducting these meetings & their object yet -

After dark attended the  
usual Prayer Meetings, which  
are held every evening.

The religious interests have  
some what abated since our  
march commenced, dangers  
which have been passed through  
seem to harder the hearts  
of men, a day or so ago I  
saw a game of cards going  
on, the first I have seen  
since I came back & before  
this campaign you could sel-  
dom hear an oath, now it  
goes on your ears at every  
turn. Still there is a great  
deal of interest in the Brigade  
yester day it was stated, that one  
of the Col's in the Brig was  
greatly interested & several  
high officers.

We have two excellent Chaplains

In the Brig. Rev Mr Tafts of the  
27<sup>th</sup> & Hopkins of the 2<sup>nd</sup>.

I wish we had Mr Jenkins  
for ours, he had a great deal  
of influence in the Regt, the  
men liked him very much  
I often wish that he was back.  
Can he not come?

This morning I took off my  
only suit I had them washed  
paying \$1.00 for the three pieces  
& now I feel that I am clean  
a feeling I have been a  
stranger to for a long time  
but this suit is white & soon  
becomes dirty & we seldom  
have a chance to wash, so  
I suppose I will be dirty  
until Winter puts an end  
to marching, as an active  
campaign seems to be the  
order of the day.
